<b>Indicator name</b>	HIV care coverage

<b>Associated terms</b>	HIV
<b>Definition</b>	Number and percentage of people living with HIV who are receiving HIV care, as proxied by receipt of at least one of the following during the reporting period: clinical assessment (WHO staging) or CD4 count or viral load or on ART.
<b>Numerator</b>	Number of HIV-positive adults and children who received HIV care (as proxied by receipt of at least one of the following during the reporting period: clinical assessment (WHO staging) or CD4 count or viral load).
<b>Denominator</b>	Estimated number of people living with HIV.
<b>Disaggregation/ additional dimension</b>	Age (< 5, 5–14, 15–19, 20–49, 50+ years), key populations, <sup>8</sup> treatment status (i.e. pre-ART or ART), pregnancy status, sex
<b>Method of measurement</b>	General populations: for the numerator, national programme records aggregated from programme monitoring tools, such as patient registers and summary reporting forms; for the denominator, estimation models such as Spectrum. Key populations: surveys.

<b>Measurement frequency</b>	Annual, or more frequently depending on frequency of data use at various levels
