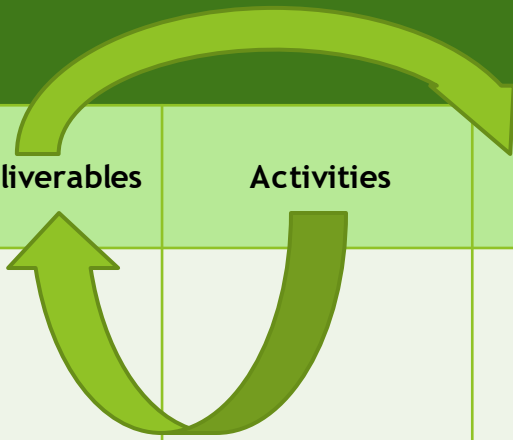

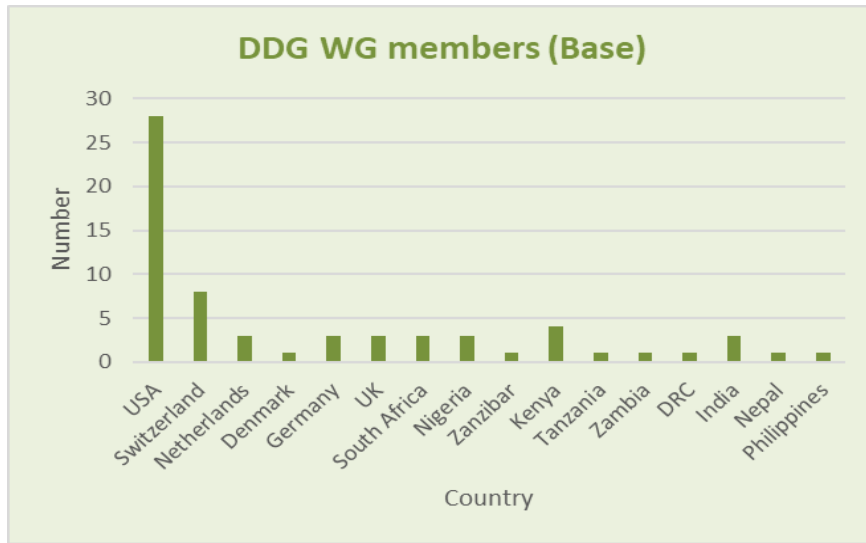

# SCORE Review

(Dec. 2022 - Apr. 2023)

## Guiding Questions of the Review:

1. What is the current state of SCORE usage (assessment data, country assessment summary, tools & standards, essential interventions) by Member States, WHO and partners?
2. What are the factors that contributed to the low/high uptake of SCORE by Member States, WHO and partners?
3. What can be done to increase the uptake of SCORE by Member States, WHO and partners?
4. How can WHO collaborate with other international organizations to increase the impact of SCORE?

The findings from the review will be used to inform the planning of the next round of **SCORE** assessment in 2024-2025.
