

Health Data Collaborative Meeting | 23-24 September 2020 Virtual meeting by Zoom

Meeting objectives

- 1. Approve 2020-2023 milestones, work plan and metrices
- 2. Agree on objectives, agenda, invitees and communications for November 'high level' political advocacy event
- 3. Agree on coordination mechanisms and support for countries

Context

COVID-19: The renewed focus on quality timely data has increased the profile and need for collaborative support for stronger Health Information Systems and aligning partner support for country driven data plans. Countries, partners and individuals' priorities have shifted to ensure detection, protection and responses to the pandemic are first priority. This has impacted essential services, such as immunization, as staff and resources are allocated elsewhere. It has challenged the constituency planning at all levels to maintain traction on agreed tasks. However, on the other hand the need for quality, timely and usable data has massively increased in profile and the HDC has been able to respond to various requests.

Governance: The constituency-based governance model, mission, objectives and principles were approved in the 19-20 March virtual meeting. This was the first partners meeting since the strategic planning retreat in January 2019 and Dec 2019-Jan 2020 stakeholder review. 7 constituencies are represented by 12 representatives. All but the private sector constituency are complete. The HDC has 3 new co-chairs and constituency-based calls have been in place since May.

Country focus: One of the main challenges faced during the 2016-2019 implementation period was demonstrating sustainable country impact. This meeting aims to hear more from countries, and framing action according to their needs – with aligned partner efforts and investments at country level, highlighted in a new theory of change.

Milestones, workplan and metrices: An initial framework for the work plan was made in March. Several constituencies gave further suggestions. This meeting aims to approve milestones, objectives activities and metrices. Possible budgets could be discussed later, once activities have been approved.

Working groups: Representatives from the five existing working groups attended monthly calls and an update have been provided. The Routine Health Information Systems Working group (RHIS) has been reconstituted and a proposal for a Data Governance working group will be considered.

Advocacy and political traction: HDC remains technically focused. Political and advocacy support at all levels – global, regional and country – now needs strengthened for Collaborative to meet its mission and objectives. Demonstrating success in terms of alignment and country impact is important to support advocacy efforts. Global and country health influencers and leaders will be invited to a high-level advocacy event to reconsider pledges made in the 2015 call to action and recognize the need for stronger political commitment for data and aligning investments with the HDC mission and goals, in the COVID-19 era.

Communications: The website has been revised and updated. All new governance documents and background tools are now publicly available. Working group spaces have been set up on the website. Various webinars have been hosted that have attracted wide audiences. Regular newsletters are planned as more country centric activities are underway.

Collaborative planning

This meeting is a result of extensive collaboration between partners and countries.

Coordination: Draft agenda received inputs from 3 HDC co-chairs 7th August and SRG on 20 August. Constituency specific facilitators gave further inputs to the agenda, substance and background documents. The agenda was finalized by the 3 co-chairs & secretariat.

Country constituency preparation: There has been intensive coordination with each of the 9 country teams to prepare one-page summaries outlining main issues for HDC coordination, focal points, issues for HIS and digital and potential HDC support 2020-2023. Results of these consultations will be presented. Some country teams may join as observers



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for the meeting.

CSO constituency preparation: The secretariat is supporting CSO efforts to strengthen country-based representation and actions and increase constituency membership.

Private sector constituency preparation: Together with the UHC 2030 core team, the secretariat initially worked with the World Economic Forum and then the World Bank to strengthen private sector participation in HDC. Several private sector constituency members will join the call as observers.

Background documents were sent on 16th September. Each session will have some slides summarizing objectives, outputs and asking pertinent questions to stimulate discussion and feedback.
