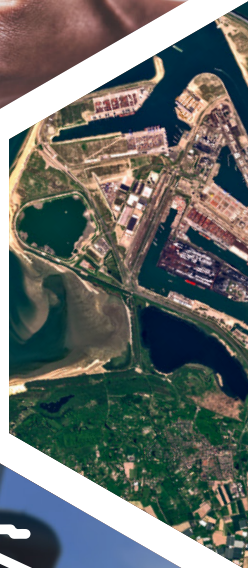
## DEFINING LOCAL DATA
